Cheryl,

The principals of public order management haven't changed – for reactionary events the first responding police arrive, take command, assess, determine risks, provide a sitrep, contain the situation and call additional resources if needed. A duty officer will generally attend and assume command.

Some of the previous restrictions on gatherings were revoked on the 14/5/20. There is no longer a requirement to stay at home except for an essential reason. People can gather outdoors in groups of 10. This order expires on the 14/8/20 unless revoked earlier. Restrictions are different for indoors.

Remember the use of COVID legislation is not designed to break up protests – the intent of the legislation is to keep people safe from COVID-19. The policing response to COVID-19 is about having a conversation, educating, explaining and helping people understand the rules. Enforcement is the last resort.

I'll have our legal team look at both the photos you sent me to get a view on whether the distancing in the photos below would breach the current rules. I'll reinforce the above with our police and ensure our response is appropriate.

The Duty Officer arrived by this time and assisted all persons out of the building without confrontation which was great.
